Monitoring Requirements Not Met for The Snake Spring Township Municipal Authority

Our water system violated several drinking water standards over the past year. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 2022 we failed to monitor for the following contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, the required sampling frequency, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which corrective action samples were (or will be) taken.

Contaminant	Required sampling frequency	Number of samples taken	When all samples should have been taken	When samples were or will be taken
Haloacetic Acids (Five)	Annual	1	7/10/2022	7/13/2022
Trihalomethanes	Annual	1	7/10/2022	7/13/2022

What happened? What was done? When will it be resolved?

Testing results for samples of the contaminants listed above were not received by the PADEP on time. Samples were taken promptly and immediately reported to the PADEP. A review of internal procedures was conducted to reduce the likelihood of violations in future years. At no point was there a threat to the public water supply. The level of haloacetic acids was below the laboratory's detection limit, while the level of trihalomethanes was 7.66 ppb, below the maximum contaminant level of 80 ppb. No further corrective action is required.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
